

The Greatest Setbacks to the
I.R.I.'s War Against Israel and
Military Nuclear-Missile Program

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In Our Opinion

For the end of the war against Israel; for the voluntary dismantling of the I.R.I.'s nuclear and missile programs; for the halting of anti-Zionist and anti-Jewish campaigns; for the halting of I.R.I. missile attacks and acts of Jewish murder in Israel; for the full withdrawal of American military forces from the Middle East;

For democracy and national sovereignty, for the creation of a government of workers and farmers; for the artistic intellectual freedom, for the lifting of the prohibition on the *Kargar* newspaper and party; for the organization of autonomous councils/unions of workers and small farmers throughout the country, and for the rights of women and ethnic groups.

Parts of Iran's uranium enrichment industry, missile facilities, and parts of Iran's nuclear-military leadership have been destroyed since Thursday, June 13, 2025, as a result of Israel's response to the I.R.I.'s war, which has been going on for decades and reached a decisive phase on October 7, 2023, with the massacre of over 1,200 residents in southern Israel.

The Shia-Bazaar government, which was founded against the principles of the 1979 revolution and has since prevented the country's long-standing aspirations for Independence and Freedom from being realized, is to blame for this conflict.

The problem—IRI's antagonism to women's rights, the rights of Aghvam (ethnic groups), religious minorities, democracy, and national

sovereignty—has been evident since the beginning of the Khomeini-Bazargan government, when it opposed the 1979 revolution and its urgent and historic demands.

The promotion of anti-Americanism and anti-Jewish-Zionism by the Shia-Bazaar regime, which was stated at that time and has persisted for more than 40 years to the present, has been the defining characteristic of this hostility to the people's immediate and historical demands.

Key fronts of anti-Semitism, or anti-Jewish-Zionist activities, in the Middle East have been destroyed by Israel's military actions in self-defense against the war fought by the Shia-Bazaar regime since October 7, 2023.

By hitting the Shia-bazaar state's nuclear-missile installations, the Middle East is getting closer to a time in history when anti-Jewish-Zionist violence won't exist.



Given the fact that the State of Israel was founded in opposition to the regional aspirations of London and Washington, which have attempted to secure imperialist interests in the oil-rich region by establishing a network of anti-Jewish semi-colonial states in the Middle East from West Asia to North Africa, Israel's victories against the I.R.I.'s Jew-killing war now pose a threat to Washington's entire historic Middle East setup. An accomplishment of the Jewish state that has been thwarted for seven decades by imperialism.

As the sole prominent winner in the reactionary wars waged against it since October 7, 2023, Israel now poses a challenge to Washington's concentration on defining and fortifying ties with affluent oil states like Saudi Arabia, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, and others.

Washington-led financial capitalism as a whole, which has supported anti-Semitism as a basic aspect of capitalist crises since the 20th century, is doing everything in its power to stop this momentous change in the Middle East in order to defeat anti-Semitism.

Washington's stance speaks for itself given its continuous attempts to

prevent Israel from winning the wars and attacks that have killed Jews:

The War Against Israel's History Since October 7, 2023

For the first time, Israel was able to deal devastating blows to Hamas gangs in Gaza that kill Jews as it confronted the war that has been fought by the Shia-Bazaar government and its proxies since October 7, despite constant opposition from Washington, Western European governments, and their organizations like the United Nations. The entire Gaza population served as a human shield for this reactionary force, which had built a network of tunnels bigger than the subway system in New York City with years of assistance from abroad.

The Hamas leaders and murderous gangs were able to hide in these tunnels, as well as in international, medical, and educational buildings, and they began an attrition-based campaign against Israel. A military triumph over Hamas was declared unattainable by Washington and its allies abroad. Today, almost 600 days later, Hamas and its allies still hold dozens of Israeli hostages, both dead and alive. Tens of thousands of Hamas members, including leaders, have been

eliminated and many have left the organization during this time.

Beginning on October 8, the day following the Jewish murder campaign launched by Hamas and the Shia-Bazaar regime against Israel, Hezbollah in Lebanon began to use explosive missiles in tandem with Hamas. Hezbollah's bombing caused the population of northern Israel to vacate the area.

The United Nations and the Red Cross, two international institutions influenced by Washington, did nothing to investigate the situation of the Israeli hostages. Hamas-aligned states like Qatar and Turkey held "understandings" and "negotiations" with the group in an effort to put a stop to the conflict. Negotiations were aided by Washington and its friends in Western Europe. The United Nations issued arrest warrants for Israeli leaders through European international organizations.

Imperialist propaganda repeated its old refrain: that, as with Hamas, a military victory over Hezbollah in Lebanon is impossible. However, Israel had no option but to protect its own existence.

Hassan Nasrallah and a number of other Hezbollah commanders were killed in an airstrike on the

organization's Beirut command headquarters on September 27, 2024.

With assistance from the I.R.I., a ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah was established in November 2024, some 14 months after Hezbollah's armed assault on northern Israel.

The Syrian regime under Assad collapsed in the first week of December 2024. A significant percentage of the Shia-Bazaar government's followers left the Tehran-based "Axis of Resistance." The I.R.I.'s nuclear and missile programs accelerated in tandem with its decline.

In an effort to further its own Middle East objectives, Washington used stalling strategies and engaged in talks with the Shia-Bazaar government to stop Israel from taking measures to defend its existence.

Washington's propaganda against confrontation with Hezbollah in Lebanon was repeated by its forecasts that the military would not be able to destroy Iran's nuclear program.

After multiple unsuccessful rounds of negotiations, Israel finally bombed and destroyed uranium enrichment facilities, missile platforms and depots, and military-nuclear leaders of the

Shia-Bazaar regime on June 13th in response to Tehran's acceleration of nuclear bomb manufacturing.

The Shia-Bazaar government's military force was shown to be ineffective during Israel's military defense of its existence. Its sole course of action was to slaughter Jews and target a hospital in Israel with hundreds of long-range missiles. Numerous buildings were destroyed as a result of these actions, and many civilians were killed or seriously injured. However, because none of the missiles had nuclear warheads, Israel eventually won despite the lethal strikes.

The Iranian Shia-Bazaar media could only act as though they had retaliated with something akin to nuclear bombs: for instance, Shargh's main page featured the devastation of Israel's Iron Dome, while Kayhan boldly headlined that Shi'a-bazaar missiles had "plowed through Israel"! Only Jew-killing on a magnitude greater than the October 7 Hamas rampage could be claimed in the propaganda of the Shia-Bazaar ruling alliance. Parts of the Shia-Bazaar government's nuclear and missile arsenal were successfully destroyed by Israel.

Under Washington's leadership, the massive financial capitalism crisis was exposed. Compared to North America and Western Europe, including the Iranian diaspora overseas, Iran has less anti-Jewish-Zionist followers.

Millions of people moved to the provinces from Tehran. Fewer people than ever before were mobilized in the streets by the regime to assist the murder of Jews and Zionists.

The necessity for the I.R.I. to dismantle the uranium and missile industries.

Mellat, the people's desire to dismantle Iran's weapons industries is more evident than ever after Israel destroyed large portions of the country's uranium and missile industries.

Together with Mellat, the people, the Kargar Party declares that the nuclear and missile programs must be voluntarily and unilaterally abandoned and eliminated. Not a single rial for the Shia-Bazaar government's military initiatives.

For the Removal of Every American Military Unit from the Middle East

Washington, the only country with weapons that could destroy the Fordow underground facilities, now says it can. The moment has arrived for

Israel to get these instruments. All actions taken by Washington to protect Iran's nuclear and missile installations must stop. As we have seen since October 7, 2023, it must stop impeding Israel's rightful self-defense, whether through disinformation, its meddling in Gaza under the guise of food distribution, or its interventions in Lebanon to protect Hezbollah, where the recognition of the Jewish state and the prohibition of all military organizations and actions against it are fundamental rights of all Lebanese. The necessity is obvious: Allow the nations and people of the Middle East to stand up for Israel's right to exist. All of Washington's armed forces must leave the Middle East.

In Support of Mellat's (the Nation) Independent Councils of Workers and Small Farmers

Preventing the autonomous organization of Iran's working people is the foundation of all European and American initiatives to uphold the Islamic Republic in Iran and to undermine the prospects for democracy and national sovereignty. Since the beginning of IRI, it has been this way, and it still is.

The time has come for the people to run the nation. Democracy and

national salvation are impossible without the autonomous organization of workers and farmers, representing all urban and rural popular classes.

Without the establishment of independent councils' of workers and farmers, it would be impossible to combat the economic disaster imposed by the Shia-Bazaar regime and Washington's sanctions. It is impossible to overcome the economic crisis until workers and small farmers, through their autonomous organizations, take control of industry and agriculture.

For Aghvam's (ethnic groups) and Women's Rights, Artistic and Intellectual Freedom, and the Revocation of the Kargar Party and Newspaper Prohibition

Shia-Bazaar (SB) rule has continuously violated the rights of women, Aghvam (ethnic groups), religious minorities, workers and farmers, migrant and Afghan workers, youth and students, artists and intellectuals, professionals, scientists, and small businesspeople since Khomeini-Bazargan established the SB government and through the subsequent handovers of power up to the current Khamenei regime.

SB rule has shattered the chances for national unity and imposed the worst economic and social corruption and cultural degradation, further eradicating national sovereignty through conflict among the Mellat ranks, terror bombings, and killings/executions by ruling factions.

By continuing the sinister divisive legacy of the Pahlavi monarchy, which SB rule has upheld in various forms, the modern-Orf woman and the traditional-Shia woman can form an alliance based on equal rights in society, including the right to work and economic independence, the unrestricted right to divorce and travel, the right to child custody, and the right to formal and vocational education.

The basis of democracy in Iran and the elimination of the sinister legacy of the Pahlavi monarchies is the right of the Aghvam to teach and receive education in their mother tongue, the right of the Turk, Kurd, Arab, Baloch, Turkmen, and Gilak peoples to national and ethnic self-governance, and the right of these groups to autonomous governments.

In every aspect of publishing, film, music, and painting, artistic and intellectual freedom is a manifestation of the peoples' identities. These rights

are still being suppressed by the Shia-Bazaar government, which is still using the authoritarian methods of the brutal Pahlavi dictatorship.

The Kargar Party, Fanous publishing house, and Kargar publication—voices of democracy and national sovereignty in the nation—must be allowed to continue operating.

For National Sovereignty and Democracy, for the Creation of a Workers' and Farmers' Government

It is impossible to attain democracy and national sovereignty without

political independence from the Shia-Bazaar regime. In both the town and the countryside, the popular classes must independently organize in order to organize the people. Ending the Shia-Bazaar's nuclear and missile programs and paving the way for economic expansion, the eradication of poverty, illiteracy, inflation, and unemployment, as well as the growth of industry, agriculture, and cultural advancement—in other words, embracing freedom and wisdom—requires the establishment of a people-based government, a government of workers and farmers.
